SSM (through your orders) purchases poinsettias and Easter plants from local growers. During my service time as Music and Worship chair, our earlier Easter flower provider went out of business. Fortunately we were able to find another, Custom Grown Greenhouses.

Luxembourg Gardens has provided our poinsettias probably since the church was founded. In December, they told us that this would be the last Christmas and they would no longer be able to provide our poinsettias due to cost considerations.

It takes a lot of expensive land, heat, and water to continue as a commercial grower in Wisconsin.

Please remember the growers that have served our church over the years when it's time to buy your house and outdoor bedding plants.

EASTER BREAKFAST - AN 'EGG-CESS'!

Hearty appetites were satisfied and church fellowship abounded on Easter morning as over 100 people enjoyed a delicious breakfast after the 7am Easter service.

The menu of scrambled and hard-boiled eggs, sliced ham, homemade rolls, applesauce, juice, coffee, milk, and homemade bakery was enjoyed by all. It was a bargain for the \$6 donation requested of the attendees.

As this article goes to press, it is not known exactly how much was donated, (To be reported in the May Newsletter) but Thrivent Financial for Lutherans will make a grant of money to SSM for our fund raising efforts.

One third of the money raised will help pay expenses for persons going on the mission trip to Northern Wisconsin this summer, while another equal portion will help pay costs of this summer's Vacation Bible Time at SSM. The final third of the money raised will enrich our Parking Lot fund which will pay for the rebuild and resurfacing of the lot.

Almost 60 people - of all ages - worked tirelessly to produce our breakfast fundraiser.

These included work crews who set up tables and chairs, decorated tables, set out place settings, purchased food, made coffee, cooked eggs, baked ham, made rolls and sweet bakery, served food, cleared away dishes, cleared furniture away, washed dishes, did laundry, hauled trash to the dump, and those who counted money, created postcards and letters to communicate work and time schedules, etc. Truly these 60 people deserve the church's gratitude for a job well done. A sincere thank you to all of you who were such a blessing to others. You most certainly followed Jesus' command to "Love one another".

Meditation... God's Way

Selah... It means, "Think about it" or "pause/meditate/reflect on it." We find this term numerous times in the Psalms.

The Puritans taught the importance of meditation on God's Word. Today the term "meditation" has a number of implications that have nothing to do with how the biblical term is used. Not in 'clearing' the mind, but in filling it with the nourishment from God's Word. Such meditation involved reciting to oneself passages of Scripture committed to memory. Psalm 1 calls the person blessed who delights in the law of the Lord and meditates on it day and night.

Spiritual growth is intended to be part of the Christian life of believers. Thomas Watson (early American Puritan) defined meditation as "a holy exercise of the mind whereby we bring the truths of God to remembrance, and do seriously ponder upon them and apply them to ourselves." Peter exhorts believers to "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." (2 Pet. 3:18). This is the kind of meditation we should not do without! Psalm 32:7 - "You are my hiding place; you will protect me from trouble and surround me with songs of deliverance. Selah!"

CONDENSED MINUTES— FEBRUARY 12, 2008

(A complete set of Minutes can be found on the Bulletin Board in the Narthex)

All Council members were present except E. Arneson, K. Giesenschlag, S. Larson, C. Malinowski and E. Sanders. Pastor Gail Brodersen-Heins and K. Penvose were also present. J. Muroi led the devotion.

Approvals: The Secretary's minutes from the February 12th meeting was reviewed and accepted. The Financial Secretary's Report was reviewed. The Treasurer's Report was discussed and approved. J. Bugajski reported that as of 3/9/08 our budgeted offerings were \$53,824.91 reflecting 91.4% of the

total budget. In regards to the Treasurer's Report, J. Bugajski commented about the snowy and cold winter and its effect on our budget, stating that as of 2/29, we had spent \$2,125.68 in plowing and salting putting us \$125.00 over budget already. The gas bill already stands at \$3,994.00 or about 39% of the total \$10,000 budgeted for 2008.

Pastor's Time: Pastor stated that 12 new members would be confirmed on April 6th. She asked that everyone keep Music and Worship people, the music staff, musicians and office staff in your prayers during the upcoming busy Holy Week. Six fourth graders will receive their first Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday. Pastor attended the Cluster III Annual meeting and will serve on the board to address issues such as what our identity is and how we can build relationships between churches. She attended the Housing of Low Income Elderly annual meeting with member Tom Raasch. There is a need to communicate with our elderly members about the availability of low-income housing. Pastor announced that Christos Counseling is in reorganization due to financial crisis. She presided at one funeral for Heidi Hennessy's mother Virginia Duelle on 2/18 and on behalf of the church attended the prayer service and committal for Nurto Rosy. Pastor will be on vacation from 3/27 to 4/1 and Lynda Shadd will also be on vacation from 3/24 to 3/30/08.

Old Action Items: J. Muroni reported that J. Bugajski will stay on for another year as the treasurer. The Nominating Committee is still looking for a member to chair Music and Worship. There will be a special meeting after service on 4/27 to elect new officers to the church council. J. Arneson stated that 130 members have attended the cottage meetings to date and he acknowledged all of the hard work done by member J. Reich in helping to promote the meetings.

New Action Items: J. Muroni, S. Lieske and S. Rosenstock commented about the recent ELCA Synod Conference and all of the wonderful workshops they attended. The Council had a long discussion on a resolution involving Health and Wellness. The sponsors of the resolution are asking for our support at the upcoming Annual ELCA Synod meeting. The Council voted by a margin of 6 to 2 that the resolution is presented to members after service on March 30th.

Committee Reports:

Human Concerns - S. Lieske encouraged members to attend the fund raiser at Ferch's on Thursday, March 13th, 2008. The committee's next project is to put health kits together for Hope House.

Music and Worship - K. Rasmussen stated that new paraments been purchased for Easter as well as fair traded palms, will be used for the first time.

Fellowship - S. Rosenstock reported that the Lent Soup and Suppers were well attended and thanked everyone that helped out with the food.

Rosy, Mursal, Barake Family Update: J. Bugajski give the Council a heartfelt update on the family since the untimely death of Nurto. He stated that Omar was about to graduate first in his class at Washington High School and was looking at attending Marquette University. J. Bugajski stated that the family was doing well, despite the loss of Nurto and that the congregation had responded very generously to the fund that was set up for the family.

The meeting adjourned at 8:55 P.M. The next Council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 8th, 2008.
