### STEWARDSHIP MUSINGS...

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life." John 3:16

This month's stewardship musings begin with words from a CHRIST IN OUR HOME devotional: On Stewardship Sunday, one pastor in her sermon told of the virtues of the congregation's biggest giver. Listing reasons, the pastor said, "He gives his best; he gives from love; he gives freely; he gives to everyone; he gives because of faith, and he gives for eternity".

At the sermon's conclusion, the pastor revealed the text as John 3:16; thus revealing the identity of the giver. "God is the biggest giver in any church," she said. The sermon's 'punch line' tied it all together. "When we evaluate our giving", she said "let us not compare ourselves with what others give. Let's compare ourselves only with what God has given and continues to give to each of us in Christ."

Christian stewardship is based on our heartfelt thanks to a God who simply cannot be out-given. As you give to the mission and ministry of your congregation, remember the generosity of God. Honor your giving pledge as you are able, give from the heart whether you pledge or not, consider giving a tenth of that economic stimulus check to SSM, directed to any of the hunger ministries in which we are involved.

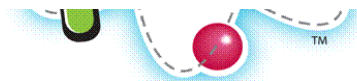

### **MYANMAR CYCLONE**

Cyclone Nargis left a path of destruction in Myanmar, leaving more than 63,000 persons killed or missing and at least a million homeless. The cyclone coincided with a storm surge tide inundating fields and islands in the vast and low lying Irrawaddy delta region, Myanmar's largest and most important river. The Myanmar government has appealed for outside assistance, though it has traditionally been suspicious of outsiders. Aid is starting to make its way to survivors amidst fears that the death toll could reach 1.5 million without provisions for clean water and sanitation.

Since the cyclone struck, aid agencies already in the country, such as Church World Service, DanChurchAid, and Norwegian Church Aid, started relief efforts with supplies they had available and by buying from local sources. Challenges still remain for other international aid agencies to get access into the country.

Getting the right supplies to the worst hit areas will be key to preventing further loss of life. The most urgent challenge is to get fresh water to those who need it. Without clean drinking water, the risk of disease spreading is the most serious concern.

Children will be especially vulnerable to diarrhea, dysentery and even cholera. Medicines including rehydration salts and antibiotics are needed urgently. Aid teams will also seek to get mosquito nets to the homeless to prevent the spread of malaria.

The stricken area is Myanmar's richest agricultural region, and it is feared the cyclone has caused terrible damage on the rice crop. World rice prices are at a record high already, provoking food riots in more than 30 countries. Myanmar is a net exporter of rice, and the destruction of crops in the Irrawaddy Delta will only add to upward pressure on international prices. The Upper Myanmar Evangelical Lutheran Church asks prayers for the people of Myanmar.

St. Stephen will be responding to the ELCA International Disaster Response. Please help by giving a donation to SSM. Note "ELCA Disaster Response" on the check's memo line; place in the offering, or send to the church office. All funds will be sent to our Greater Milw. Synod office and sent on to ELCA Int'l Disaster Relief. 100% of your gift will be used as you designate.

### **Operation Freedom - July 6, 2008 - 9 am - 6 pm**

#### **At the Milwaukee County Zoo**

Operation Freedom is a joint effort of Milwaukee County and the Military Order of the Purple Heart to say thank you to our veterans and current service personnel and their families for all their sacrifices for this country. Admission is free but a wristband is needed for each attendee. A free lunch and beverages are provided. Last year attendance was 17,000.

All foods items are donated. One of the items we never have enough of are cookies. I would like to invite the families of St. Stephen the Martyr to help fill this need by donating cookies for this event. Starting June 14th there will be a container labeled for Operation Freedom in the narthex so you can donate cookies. If you would like to donate cash toward the purchase of cookies that would be great. Cash donations may be placed in my mailbox. Home baked or store bought will be accepted. All Council members present except S. Larson. Pastor Gail Brodersen-Heins present. Kevan Penvose absent.

Pastor Gail led devotion.

**Approvals:** The Secretary's April 8th, 2008 minutes were reviewed. A change was made under Old Action Items - E. Sanders reported that the Nominating Committee that C. Peterson and S. Jarchow would co-chair Music and Worship. The minutes were accepted with that correction.

**Guest Presentation:** Member Rose Ann Dieck addressed Council and spoke about Operation Freedom, an event where all veterans and families can attend the Zoo for free. The event is scheduled for July 6th, 2008. The event has tripled in attendance, and as such, Rose Ann is asking for support of Council and members of church, to help with the event by either donating money to purchase cookies or make cookies for the event.
