

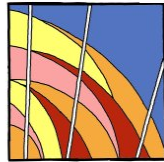
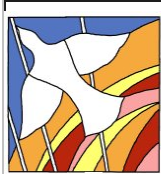

Lent 2010 Stories of Faith

"Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Hebrews 11:1

February 17th marks the beginning of Lent as we observe Ash Wednesday with a 7:00 PM service of Holy Communion and as we come forward to receive the ashes on our foreheads and hear the jolting words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

On Ash Wednesday, the ashes you receive will be a silent witness as you go about your regular routine. Just like at our baptism, we are "marked with the cross of Christ forever". We "go into the wilderness" as Jesus did at the time of his temptation. And we take time for remorse and repentance, remembering that our days on this earth are numbered. We know that we have opportunities to go in new directions, living not just for ourselves but for God and for others.

ON the five Wednesdays following Ash Wednesday, we will gather for worship at 7:00 PM. We will once again sing and pray the beautiful Holden Evening Prayer Service. This year, there will be brief conversations around the subject of faith. I invite any members who would like to share some reflections in response to questions like the following: "How long have you been a believer? How has your faith taken shape over the years? Have there been others who have helped you in your faith life? When was a time when your faith was tested? How did God respond to you in those times? Or was God silent? How is your faith journey going? Has this community of faith helped you?"

If you would like to be part of one of these conversations, please contact me soon. We can do a little 'rehearsing' and work on how to share the dialogue with the gathered group.

DON'T FORGET: There will be SOUP SUPPERS beginning at 6:00 PM each Wednesday. And watch for details on a possible Bible study both before and after Wednesday Worship!

HAITI EARTHQUAKE RELIEF

On Tuesday, January 12, a magnitude 7.0 earthquake rocked the island country of Haiti, primarily impacting the capital, Port-au-Prince. An aftershock of 6.1, Tuesday, January 20, caused more damage to an already impoverished nation. Offices, hotels, houses and shops have collapsed. The presidential palace is in ruins and many churches were destroyed. Aid is beginning to come in, but so much work is yet to be done.

Your help is needed today to bring relief and continued hope for our brothers and sisters in Haiti. About 3 million lives, one-third of Haiti's population, are affected by this devastation. Already one of the poorest countries in the world (70 percent of Haiti's population lives in extreme poverty), this catastrophe has exacerbated the suffering felt by many already living with hunger and poverty. Responding to God's Love

One of the chief purposes of our ELCA is "to serve in response to God's love to meet human needs."

This February offers many opportunities to serve, as good stewards, in response to God's love in three focus areas:

as members of our congregation by sharing our time, talents and treasures;

as members of our synod by proclaiming and living God's saving Gospel in shared mission and ministry;

as members of the worldwide Church to carry out God's love to meet human needs through prayers and monetary donations.

While the devastation caused by the January 12th massive earthquake in Haiti remains deeply ingrained in our minds, hearts and prayers, it serves as a critical reminder of our stewardship call, "to respond to God's love to meet human needs."

Our response as Lutherans of faith and service is evidenced by the Lutheran World Federation Haiti Program (LWF). Thankfully, the initial reports indicate the LWF Haiti staff escaped injury. These dedicated stewards were on the ground providing food and shelter in an immediate and effective first response. Although the majority of our congregation cannot provide person-to-person daily service to others in dire need, there is much we can do. The weekly bulletin distributed on January 16th and 17th provided ways to respond.

Lent begins on February 17th -a time to reflect on God's love for us. God met our human need for grace and forgiveness through the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus. What can we do in response to God's love for us? How can we serve in thanksgiving for all God has done to meet our need of His grace? During this Lenten

season, please consider prayerful reflection on Luke 12:48, "For everyone to whom much is given, of him shall much be required." This Lent is special because the human and spiritual needs are so great -locally, throughout the synod and globally as in Haiti, Somalia, Afghanistan and more.

Most of us are neither wealthy nor have athletic or star power. Yet, we all have God-given talent to share within our congregation and our synod. We all have the ability and time to pray for all our sisters and brothers in need -locally and worldwide.

All stewardship gifts of time, talent and treasure are deeply appreciated in our yearlong "Walk With Jesus".

There are things you can do at home like rip the stitching out of twin size sheets, wash and iron them. The twin size sheets are used for the back of quilts. Some ladies prefer to take quilts home and tie them there. You don't have to do any sewing to join the group.

Council Minutes

Condensed Council Minutes, Jan 12, 2010

Council members present were: J. Arneson, J. Bugajski, J. Covert, J. Hennessy S. Lieske, S. Lubus, J. Miller, J. Muroi, C. Peterson, S. Rosenstock and E. Sanders. Pastor Gail Brodersen-Heins was also present. C. Guiliani & S. Jarchow excused.

Approvals: Secretary's minutes from Nov 2009 meeting will be re-presented for approval at February Council meeting. December secretary minutes were approved with changes: J. Miller was listed as both present & excused. J. Miller was present at the December meeting. J. Covert, in Stewardship report, stated that due to time restrictions he did not report on Stewardship, rather than "there was nothing to report." The Financial Secretary's Report was reviewed. The Treasurer's Report was reported. Council reviewed a report by J. Bugajski reviewing all of the church's 42 charitable donations for 2009. Despite a slow economic year, we were only \$150.00 less in giving in 2009 as compared to 2008. As of December 27th, 2009 total offerings were short \$13,294.59 or 95.7% of the weekly budgeted amount. In 2009 we met all of our monetary obligations to Southwest Inter-Faith, Lutheran Social Services, Wartburg Seminary and Grow Hanson Missionaries.

Correspondence: J. Muroi read an email from S. Jarchow—she is recuperating at home. She will try to be back in church and at Council meetings as soon as possible. S. Lubus read a thank-you letter from Southwest Inter-Faith that expressed thanks for our generous donation of \$1000.00.

Pastor's Time: Pastor thanked B. Bravener, J. Snyder, S. Gordon, K. Sachse and all the musicians for a beautiful Advent & Christmas concert & SS program. She thanked everyone responsible, especially Music & Worship & Property, who helped decorate the church. 50 people attended the New Year's Eve communion service held at St. Luke's. Lent begins Ash Wednesday, 2/17/10; Holden Evening Prayer service will be used. For Lenten sermons she plans to interview members willing to discuss their faith journey. Sunday, 2/14/10 will be a very special day as Pastor celebrates her 20th anniversary of her ordination with a service and catered brunch to follow. A speaker from ELCA World Hunger, Rev. Larry Westfield, will preach. No 8 am service the 14th. Council was reminded about K. Penvose's ordination & installation, Sat., Jan. 16 at Unity Church at 3 PM. **Old Action Items:** J. Muroi reminded Council members that all their reports and slides for the Annual Meeting were due by 1/25/10. The Annual meeting is 1/31/10. There will be NO 8 am service.

New Action Items: Council reviewed final 2010 budget. No major changes to report so Council approved the budget for 2010 as \$322,000,000. Member R. Rasmussen submitted a report to Council outlining a proposal from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans about a fund raising idea. Thrivent will match funds up to \$900.00 for any fund raiser event the Church hosts. It was approved that money raised at the Easter breakfast will be submitted to Thrivent to match what is raised at the breakfast. Traditionally the Easter Breakfast profit money averages close to the \$900.00 amount.

Committee Reports:

Family & Youth Ministries-C. Guiliani stated that Parent's day Out was a huge success with 32 children participating. C. Guiliani and S. Gordon attended a Youth Workers Retreat at Imago Dei Village for presentations & training. Camp dates: 8/15 to 8/20. Next Family gathering is Saturday, 1/16/10 at 6 PM. **Human Concerns-S.** Lieske reported that Knit Wits group is distributing projects to bus drivers, who pass them out to the bus-riders in need.

Christian Education-E. Sanders reported that on May 9th an intergenerational music program will be presented during 9:30 service. Book of Faith program will again be offered during Lenten services. **Stewardship-J.** Covert report: his committee has been brainstorming. They will reintroduce the Time & Talent surveys and develop a database with info provided from the surveys.

Music Church and Worship-C. Peterson stated that her committee is preparing for the upcoming Lent and Easter services. She also stated she meets once a week with S. Jarchow and is keeping her abreast of things while she recuperates at home.

Fellowship - S. Rosenstock is asking confirmation students to participate in the upcoming Soup and Supper

programs during Wednesday lent services.

Evangelism -J. Hennessy reported that he is looking for new members to help him reenergize this committee. He is also working on some ideas with Stewardship.

Executive Committee Comments: J. Bugajski told Council that when we applied for the home improvement loan there was a one percent service fee, which amounted to \$2800.00. He suggested that Council consider paying off that amount from unused monies from home improvement loan. J. Muroi asked that the idea be tabled until the February meeting to give him time to see if that idea is financially sound. J. Bugajski stated that Apple Pre School was one month short in their contribution for renting some of the church's space for their preschool. Pastor stated she would talk to them about the missed payment.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 P.M.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 9th, 2010.
