What Does the Bible Say About Dads?

The greatest commandment in Scripture is this: "Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength," Deuteronomy 6:5. A few verses before that it says, "So that you, your children and their children after them may fear the LORD your God as long as you live by keeping all his decrees and commands that I give you, and so that you may enjoy long life." Following Deuteronomy 6:5, we read, "These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up" (vv. 6-7).

Hebrew history reveals that the father was to be diligent in instructing his children in the ways and words of the Lord for their own spiritual development and well-being. The father who was obedient to the commands of Scripture did just that. This brings us to Proverbs 22:6, "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." To "train" indicates the first instruction that a father and mother give to a child, i.e., early education.

Ephesians 6:4 gives instructions to the father, stated in both the negative and positive. "Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord." The negative part of this verse indicates that a father is not to foster negativity in his children by severity, injustice, partiality, or unreasonable exercise of authority. Harsh, unreasonable conduct towards a child will only serve to nurture evil in the heart. The word "provoke" means "to irritate, exasperate, rub the wrong way, or incite." This is done by a wrong spirit and wrong methods—severity, sternness, unreasonableness, harshness, cruel demands, needless restrictions, and selfish insistence upon dictatorial authority. Such provocation will produce adverse reactions, deadening children's affection, reducing their desire for holiness, and making them feel that they cannot possibly please their parents. A wise parent seeks to make obedience desirable and attainable by love and gentleness.

The positive part of Ephesians 6:4 is a comprehensive direction—educate them, bring them up, develop their conduct in all of life by the instruction and admonition of the Lord. This is the whole process of educating and discipline. The word "admonition" carries the idea of reminding the child of faults (constructively) and duties (responsibilities).

The Christian father is really an instrument in God's hand. The whole process of instruction and discipline must be that which God commands and which He administers, so that His authority should be brought into constant and immediate contact with the mind, heart, and conscience of children. The human father should never present himself as the ultimate authority to determine truth and duty. It is only by making God the teacher and ruler on whose authority everything is done that the goals of education can best be attained.

Discipline must be exercised with watchful care and constant training with much prayer. Chastening, discipline, and counsel by the Word of God, giving both reproof and encouragement, is at the core of "admonition." Christian discipline is needed to enable children to grow up with love and reverence for God, respect for parental authority, knowledge of Christian standards, and habits of self-control.

"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16-17). A father's most important responsibility is to acquaint his children with Scripture. The means and methods that fathers may use to teach God's truth will vary. As the father is faithful in role modeling, what children learn about God will put them in good standing throughout their earthly lives, no matter what they do or where they go.

Highlights of Council Minutes, May 10, 2011

The Secretary's March meeting minutes were approved via email among Church Council members. There was no April Council Meeting.

Treasurer's Report: J. Bugajski - as of 5/8/11 total offerings were \$1,793.89 over budget with a 101.63%. J. Bugajski stated that the new Thrivent Choice program was doing well, with \$2800 in that account. The Easter breakfast generated \$825. Thrivent matches that amount. A total of \$1650 will be dispersed to the two food pantries we support. Over \$3,000 was given during Lenten services. \$1,000 from the Craft & Bake sale paid for new lights in sanctuary/fellowship hall. Pastor's Time: Pastor Gail stated she was very grateful for all who participated in Holy Week and Easter services. She especially thanked the music department, & B. Rasmussen and J.P. Maschke for the wonderful Easter breakfast. She thanked her colleagues, Pastor J. Worth and Pastor S. Ruehle for filling in for her while she was on vacation. She thanked C. Manning for organizing the family dinner for the pre-communion class, who received first communion on Maundy Thursday. She thanked Pastor H. Barsnick and 12 German students from Halberstadt, who participated in the April 9th Saturday worship service. She congratulated C. Guiliani on her graduation from the Youth and Family Certification School. Pastor presided at the baptism of Regan Louise Kunesh on April 23rd and at the funeral of Mitchell William Fischer on March 29th, 2011. There are now five women involved with "Caring Visitors", visiting our shut ins. There is a Partnership meeting between Unity, Faith and SSM on May 22nd at Unity at 3 PM.

Old Action Items: J. Muroni announced that he is leaving Council after six years as Council President. A special Congregational meeting to elect new members to the Council is Sunday, May 28th. New Action Items - Safety Plan for SSM - Pastor Gail talked about developing a Safety Plan for the Church, recommended by the Greater Milw. ELCA Synod.

Committee Reports: Youth and Family - C. Guiliani stated the recent 30 Hour Famine with the youth went very well. Upcoming events include a Brewer's game, Youth and Family Camp at Crossways and their monthly meetings at family member's homes.

Property Committee - J. Arneson thanked D. Rutzen, R. Ropel, R. Rutzen, & F. O'Connell for doing special projects such as painting inside the arch wall, putting cabinets in the men's bathroom and putting up lights in the Fellowship Hall. There is still a need for more spring cleaning on the outside of the church. Human Concerns - P. Gustafson reported that her committee put together 12 baskets for shut-ins. Their June project is to gather first aid items for the Health clinic at Unity church. Stewardship: J. Covert stated the Steward of the Month for May is the Senior Choir, nominated by D. Winter. SSM members will now be receiving their quarterly statements via email, if applicable. Otherwise those members not having a computer will still receive them via regular mail. Music and Worship - S. Jarchow reported that Lenten services went very well. Usher and communion servers schedules will be out soon. The summer schedule of one Sunday service will start on May 29th, 2011. Pentecost weekend is June 11th and 12th, and she encouraged everyone to wear something red. Evangelism - J. Hennessy stated that he placed an ad in the paper NOW advertising SSM's recent Lenten church services.
